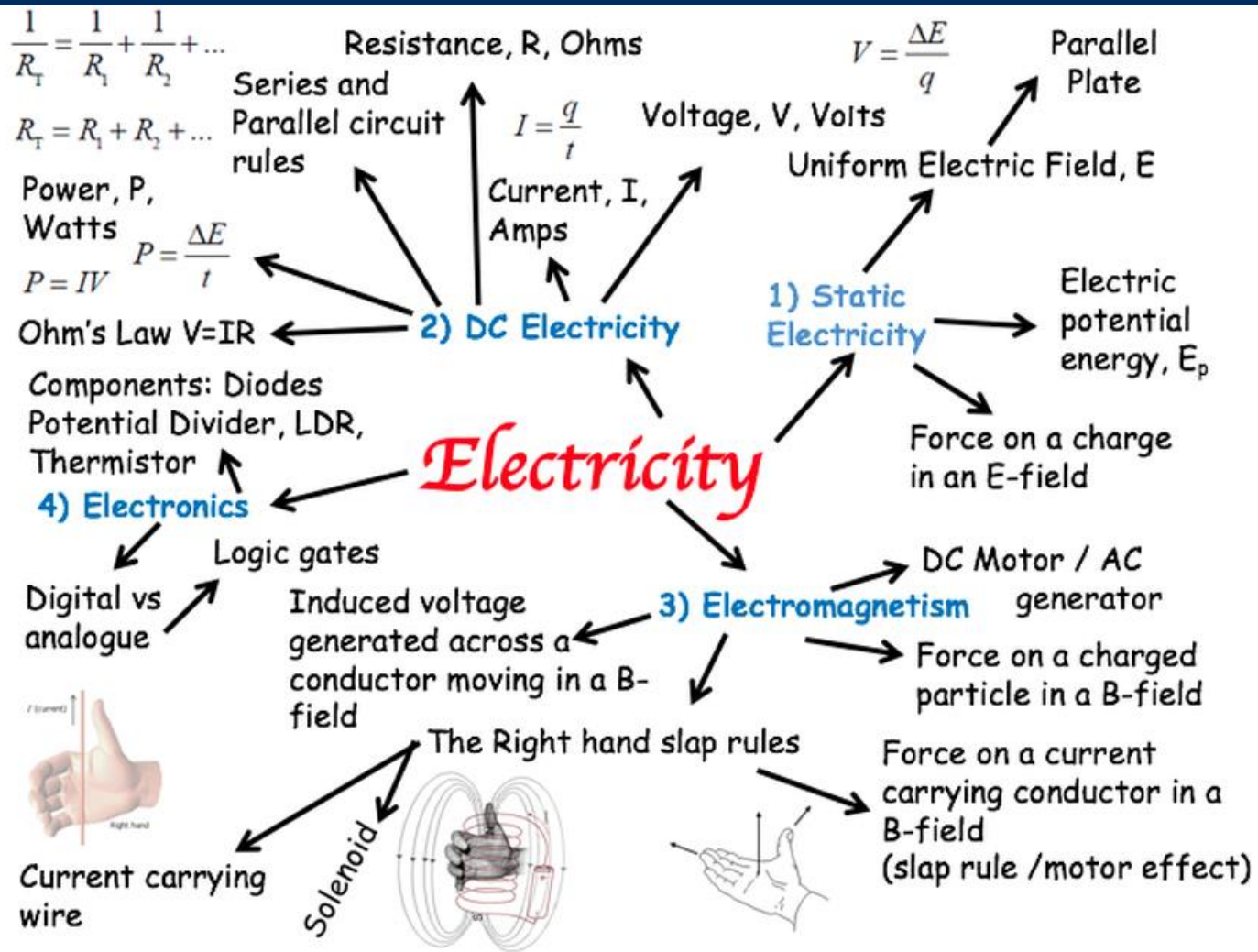

- Make it even more effective – use

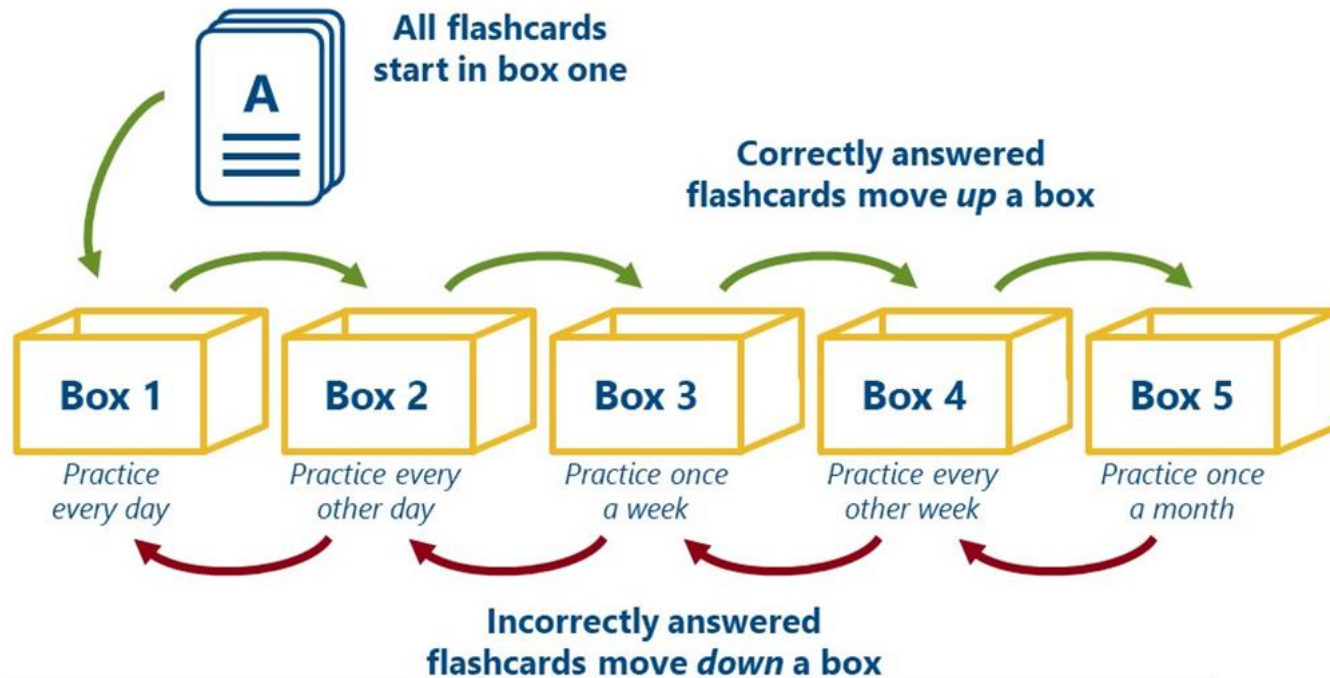
'DUAL CODING' Use

Year 11 Revision Tips – Flashcards

Leitner Method



- Great for recalling key facts
- **Keep it simple – on one side of the flashcard write a word/question or a quote**
- **On the other side write the definition/answer or where the quote is from**
- Use **colours/highlighters** to make the information more memorable
- Use the Leitner method to help you use them successfully

SUPERPOWER RELATIONS AND THE COLD WAR, 1941-91: KEY INDIVIDUALS

JOSEPH STALIN (1878-1953)

- Stalin was the leader of the Soviet Union and a key figure in the wartime alliance with the United States and the UK
- His leadership and policies in the aftermath of World War II contributed to tensions and the division of Europe

HARRY S. TRUMAN (1884-1972)

- Truman succeeded Franklin D. Roosevelt as President of the United States and made critical decisions, such as the use of atomic bombs in World War II and the Truman Doctrine
- His leadership marked the beginning of the Cold War and the U.S. policy of containment

NIKITA KHRUSHCHEV (1894-1971)

- Khrushchev was the First Secretary of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union and played a role in several Cold War crises, including the Cuban Missile Crisis
- His leadership brought significant changes to the Soviet Union and affected superpower relations

RONALD REAGAN (1911-2004)

- Reagan served as the 40th President of the United States and implemented a strong anti-communist stance, famously calling the Soviet Union an 'evil empire'
- His policies, including the Strategic Defence Initiative (SDI), contributed to the end of the Cold War

FIDEL CASTRO (1926-2016)

- Castro was the revolutionary leader who led the Cuban Revolution and established a communist regime in Cuba
